You've already learned about **-er** verbs in French. Here are the forms for a group of verbs that end in **-re**.

attendre (to wait for)					
j'	attend s	nous	attend ons		
tu	attend s	vous	attend ez		
il/elle/on	attend	ils/elles	attend ent		

Il attend Agathe.

Nous attendons le bus.

Notice that in the third person singular form, you do not add an ending to the stem.

Verbs that end in -ger are conjugated like -er verbs in every form except the nous form. In the nous form, you add before the ending -ons. This is to keep the soft ge sound, as in the other forms.

manger (to eat)					
je	mange	nous	mang e ons		
tu	manges	vous	mangez		
il/elle/on	mange	ils/elles	mangent		

2 Verbs that end in -cer are also conjugated like -er verbs in every form except the nous form. In the nous form, c becomes c to keep the soft s sound as in the other forms.

commencer (to begin, to start)				
je	commence	nous	commençons	
tu	commences	vous	commencez	
il/elle/on	commence	ils/elles	commencent	

The verb **commencer** is followed by the preposition à and another verb in the infinitive to mean *to start to do something.*

Nous commençons à travailler après le week-end.

We start working after the weekend.

placer to place, put prononcer to pronounce
